

Introduction of changes reporting categories Dutch WEEE regulation Year of report 2019 and beyond

From 15 August 2018, several changes of the Dutch WEEE regulation have come into force. However, in order to keep the report clear and comparable, it was decided in consultation with the Ministry of Infrastructure and Water Management that the corresponding change in reporting categories will be applied as from 1 January 2019.

This document specifies the categories in which producers and recyclers must report to the Nationaleal (W)EEE Register from January 1, 2019. This document has been agreed with the Ministry of Infrastructure and Water Management and Rijkswaterstaat.

Reporting categories Dutch WEEE regulation valid from January 1, 2019

1	Temperature exchange equipment
A	Temperature exchange equipment (household/dual-use)
B	Temperature exchange equipment (professional ¹)
2	Screens, monitors, and equipment containing screens having a surface > 100 cm²
A	CRT screens (household/dual-use)
B	Flatpanels (household/dual-use)
C	Laptops, tablets en navigation equipment ² (household/dual-use)
D	Screens, monitors and equipment with screens (professional ¹)
3	Lamps
A	Led lamps
B	Fluorescent, energy saving and gas discharge lamps
4	Large equipment (any external dimension > 50 cm)*
A	Large equipment (>50cm household/dual-use excl. photovoltaic panels, e-bikes)
B	Large equipment (>50cm professional ¹ excl. photovoltaic panels, e-bikes)
C	Photovoltaic panels ³
D	E-bikes ²
5	Small equipment (no external dimension > 50 cm)**
A	Small equipment (≤50cm household/dual-use)
B	Small equipment (≤50cm professional ¹)
6	Small IT and telecommunication equipment (no external dimension > 50 cm)
A	IT and telecommunication equipment (≤50cm household/dual-use)
B	IT and telecommunication equipment (≤50cm professional ¹)

* This category does not include equipment included in categories 1 to 3

** This category does not include equipment included in categories 1 to 3 and 6

¹ The distinction between household/dual-use and professional applies to the report of Put on Market. For recycling this distinction can hardly be made and everything can be reported under household/dual-use. If the distinction cannot or hardly be made for the Put on Market, a substantiated estimation is sufficient.

² For the reporting categories laptops, tablets and navigation equipment and e-bikes, a substantiated estimation (sampling) is sufficient for the reporting of recycling.

³ Photovoltaic panels with an external dimension of ≤ 50 cm can be reported in this category. The share of photovoltaic panels with an external dimension of ≤ 50 cm is estimated at less than 1%. This division will be mapped using samples and will be reported separately..
